



Contract Grief Counselor (KANSAS)

This position provides, under supervision, a range of psychological assessment, diagnostic, and therapeutic services for patients referred. This position adheres to the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) professional code of ethics and practice standards, or the APA Practice Standards and Code of Ethics, as applicable.

Specific Duties:

- Provides in-home mental health crisis intervention, screenings, and assessments, for patients referred.
- Provides counseling and/or psychotherapy with individuals and groups.
- Collects client level data through interview, case history, psychological tests, and/or observational techniques; evaluates data to identify causes of problems and to determine proper therapeutic approach or referral to other specialists.
- Accurately and in a timely manner maintain appropriate case files through the preparation of treatment plans, discharge plans, progress notes etc.
- Work collaboratively with AdHoc staff and local human service organizations, treatment centers, and other community based organizations in order to facilitate appropriate care coordination, information, and referral.
- Follows up to determine reliability and validity of treatment used; makes recommendations regarding modification to services and service delivery.
- Participates in the review of clinical issues and program policies and procedures.
- Supports quality management and program evaluation activities by providing statistical information on program activities as requested by supervisor.
- Supports the mission and vision of AdHoc, is a team member of the AdHoc Group Against Crime; supporting other staff members when needed.
- All other duties as assigned by the President or Senior Staff Member when required for the smooth operation of AdHoc and/or its Administrative functions.

Qualifications:

- Master's degree in Counseling, Social Work, Psychology or direct related field;
- Minimum 4 years of directly related experience.
- **Kansas licensure as LCPC, or LPC, or LCSW, or equivalent level.**
- Must have good interpersonal skills with ability to relate to clients from diverse backgrounds.
- Experience in providing both group and individual therapy.

Hours: vary depending on client and therapist schedules, below is the range.
